


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Welcome and Acknowledgments





Dr. Van de Ven is the Vernon H. Heath Professor of Organizational Innovation and Change in the Carlson School of the University of Minnesota and founding editor of *Academy of Management Discoveries*. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin at Madison in 1972, and

taught at the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania before his present appointment. He teaches courses on the management of innovation and change, organizational behavior, and research methods.

In addition to organizational innovation and change, Van de Ven's books and journal articles over the years have dealt with the Nominal Group Technique, organization assessment, inter-organizational relationships, and research methods. He is co-author of 12 books, including: The Innovation Journey (1999, 2008), Organization Change and Innovation Processes (2000), Handbook of Organizational Change and Innovation (2004), and Engaged Scholarship (2007), which won the 2008 Terry best book award from the Academy of Management. During 2000-2001 Van de Ven was President of the Academy of Management.



Fred Luthans

University and George Holmes Distinguished Professor of Management University of Nebraska—Lincoln

Dr. Luthans is the University and George Holmes Distinguished Professor of Management in the College of Business Administration at the University of Nebraska—Lincoln. He is the Editor of Organizational Dynamics, Co-Editor-in-Chief for the Journal of World Business, and Co-Editor-in-Chief for the Journal of Leadership and Organization Studies. He teaches courses on organizational behavior and international management.

He received his B.A., M.B.A., and Ph.D. from the University of lowa, and was a post-doc at Columbia University. He taught at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point prior to joining the UNL faculty in 1967. He won the College of Business Administration Distinguished Teaching Award and the University of Nebraska Excellence in Graduate Education Award. He is a former



President of the Academy of Management and a recipient of an honorary doctorate from DePaul University, the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Iowa, and the Academy of Management's Distinguished Educator Award. He is an inaugural member of the Academy of Management Hall of Fame, as well as a fellow in the Decision Sciences Institute. A prolific writer, Dr. Luthans has published 45 books, 166 articles in refereed journals, and over 200 articles and book chapters. His book, Organizational Behavior, is in its eleventh edition and is considered the first text in its field. Most recently, Dr. Luthans is researching positive organizational behavior (POB) and positive psychological capital and the effect of microinterventions in increasing competitive advantage for today's organizations. Luthans and his team of researchers have brought this concept and its measurement to management literature in recent publications in top-tier journals such as Personal Psychology and Journal of Management.

This program is **open to all Conference participants interested in crafting effective case studies to expand the knowledge and abilities of MBA and upper-level undergraduate students**. This **session builds on knowledge gained during the pre-conference program at University of Wisconsin-Stout**. However, participation in the Thursday program is not a prerequisite for learning how Baldrige applicants and award recipients, to which many MWAM members have access, represent a target-rich community for case study development.

The University of Wisconsin-Stout preconference session will provide foundational knowledge about the Baldrige process and criteria within pre-readings generated through the registration process, but **those who attend this session will also obtain critical support materials**. Practitioners will also gain new insights on how the Baldrige program drives performance excellence. 


