Arts

Fertile Ground Mural

Measuring 70 feet tall and 465 feet long, the mural titled "Fertile Ground" is one of the largest murals in the country. Created by internationally acclaimed artist Meg Saligman, the 32,500 square-foot masterpiece tells the story of Omaha from historical references to present-day neighbors to the far-reaching dreams of the many children in the mural. The mural is largest public art project in the history of the city and was a gift to Omaha from the Peter Kiewit Foundation.

Hot Shops Art Center

Over 80 artists invite you to explore this 92,000 square foot art center. Four "hot shops" featuring glass blowing, pottery, bronze casting and blacksmithing, as well as over 50 individual studios and four art galleries. Come visit the studios, view the artwork, and see how it is created. Artwork includes watercolors, oils, acrylics, fiber art, photography, pastels, jewelry, printmaking, stained glass, fused glass, metal and wood sculpture, furniture restoration, lampworking, ceramics, mixed media and more.

Joslyn Art Museum

Nebraska's largest art museum is a major regional resource for the collection, preservation, and interpretation of the visual arts. Dedicated to excellence and celebrating art in all its variety, the Museum maintains a collection of art historical significance, ranging from antiquity to the present, with special emphasis on nineteenth- and twentieth-century European and American art. Through its collection, exhibitions, and education programs, Joslyn Art Museum seeks to foster appreciation and enjoyment of art for the benefit of a diverse audience.

MANGELSEN - Images of Nature Gallery

The Midwest Academy Doctoral Consortium is an opportunity for doctoral students in all stages of their program to make connections with colleagues, receive developmental feedback in regards to their teaching and research ideas, and ask their most pressing questions to fellow students and more experienced academic faculty. The consortium will provide a supportive, developmental environment where graduate students from a wide range of programs can meet and discuss important issues such as dissertation progress, navigating the job search process, submitting research for publication, and what to expect during the early career stages.

The doctoral consortium will be divided into three segments: teaching, research, and Q & A. In past years, we have found that doctoral students have many important questions on a wide range of topics, and we have dedicated a segment of our consortium to make sure these questions are answered. During the teaching segment, students will learn tips and techniques from experienced and award winning teachers--from engagement strategies to innovative assignment ideas. During the research session, students will learn the importance of strong research collaborations, how to navigate the review process, and receive advice and feedback from the editor of the journal of the Midwest Academy--the Journal of Leadership and Organizational Studies. Participants will also have an opportunity to discuss and receive feedback on their current research ideas as part of a research incubator from 1:30-3:30pm.

Jim Harter, Ph.D., is Chief Scientist, Workplace Management and Wellbeing, for Gallup's workplace management practice. His research has been reported in several business bestsellers and in academic articles, book chapters, and publications such as USA Today, The Wall Street Journal, and The New York Times. He is coauthored of the New York Times bestseller 12: The Elements of Great Managing, an exploration of the 12 crucial ingredients for creating and harnessing employee engagement. Harter's latest book, the New York Times and Wall Street Journal bestseller Wellbeing: The Five Essential Elements, is based on a global study of what differentiates people who are thriving from those who are not.

Harter is the primary researcher and author of the first meta-analysis to investigate the relationships between work unit employee engagement and business reports. This study, which is updated periodically, currently covers 32,000 business units in 44 industries and 26 countries. He is coauthor of "Manage Your Human Sigma," published in the Harvard Business Review (July/August, 2005). This groundbreaking management approach assesses and improves the quality of the employee-customer encounter.

Since joining Gallup in 1985, Harter has authored or coauthored more than 1,000 research studies for profit and nonprofit organizations on employee engagement and talent and on topics in industrial and organizational psychology and wellbeing. His specialties include psychological measurement and the estimation of the practical effect of management initiatives.
